They recall the CCH as a safe haven, and when it's time to reach out to family, the CCH staff is the family that comes to mind and they consider the Christ Child House their former home.

We don't serve the masses; currently we hold 21 little hearts and minds while we are tasked to help them through this rough patch of their lives. The Galencher Nagy Foundation to Receive Mary Virginia Merrick Award

Congratulations to this year's Christ Child Society Mary Virginia Merrick Award winner, the Galencher Nagy Foundation! The Mary Virginia Merrick Award honors an individual or entity that has exemplified the virtue of our foundress, who believed "Nothing is ever too much to do for a child." Her life's work went to providing for children in need. Similarly, the Galencher Nagy Foundation is a family-run non-profit foundation dedicated to serving children in need and is run by its President, Val Ellis.

Since 2014, the Galencher Nagy Foundation has donated \$26,000 to the development and ongoing support of the art enrichment program at the Christ Child House. This funding enabled the start-up of the program, purchase of all art materials, furnishings for the classroom, and payment of the art teacher/therapist's salary. Since its inception, approximately 60 art classes have been provided for the boys. They are exposed to all types of media and forms of expression. The curriculum includes lessons in clay, pastels, paint, paper, collage, found objects, and 3-D sculpture. These classes provide a safe and therapeutic environment while providing growth and healing through self-expression and creativity. Val and her daughter are frequent volunteers at the classes (her daughter, Lauren, comes every week) and have immersed themselves in the art projects with the boys. They know the kids by name and contribute to the consistent, fun, and therapeutic environment that has made the program so successful and popular among the boys.

The Christ Child Society is fortunate and very grateful for the philanthropic support of the Galencher Nagy Foundation. The very valuable and therapeutic art enrichment program that this foundation provides support to, without a doubt enhances the lives of the children we serve. The award will be presented at our Night of Angels event, "A Starry Night," on Friday, September 29th at The Detroit Athletic Club.



House Happenings

There is a quote I heard once, the author is unknown, and it says, "One hundred years from now, it won't matter what kind of car you drove, what kind of house you lived in, how much money you had in your bank account, nor what your clothes looked like, but the world may be a little better because you were important in the life of a child." On behalf of the staff and the boys at Christ Child House (CCH), thank you to the Christ Child Society, the Advisory Council, donors and supporters for all you do to help fulfill the mission of CCH. We truly appreciate your generosity and support of our mission and challenging work. Thank you for helping us continue this legacy of love and hope that makes a difference in and changes the lives of the boys we serve. Without you, there is no us. May you be rewarded and richly blessed for remembering these boys.

As we navigate into the second half of 2017, there still continues to be uncertainty about the future of human and social service programs including mental health, healthcare and public education. CCH also experienced internal challenges with key

positions being vacant and difficult to fill. However, in spite of these challenges, CCH continued to meet the ever-changing

needs of the boys we serve. Join me in welcoming to the team, Mr. James Jones, Director of Residential Services, Mr. Sean Seal, the Afternoon Shift Supervisor and Ms. Kayla Mishler, Trauma Informed Clinical Therapist. Mr. Jones is already working on new pro-

gramming for the fall and Ms. Mishler has already begun to meet with the boys for individual therapy for focus on helping them cope with the trauma they have experienced.

Christ Child House currently has 20 boys, with six of them being new to the House since January 2017. Since the beginning of the year, one boy has moved to a Supervised Independent Living Situation, one boy was reunited with his family and one boy is in the process of being adopted. We are happy about these placements.

The educational, recreational, social and cultural enrichment program goals con-

tinue to be met. The boys were in ten Detroit Public Schools in order to meet their educational needs. Tutoring and educa-

tional programming in the evenings proved to be successful as the school year ended with two boys with a 4.0 grade point average and six with a 3.0 GPA. Educational programming, music therapy and speech therapy all continue as part of the summer activities. The summer

is also filled with great recreational, social and cultural activities and outings. Some included trips to the Red Oaks Water Park, Whirly Ball, Michigan Adventure, the Detroit Zoo, Michigan Science Center, Laser Quest, Air Time, Bounce It Up, Dave and Busters; and trips to the movie theater, shopping, bible class, bike riding and picnics.

CCH continues to facilitate the hopes and dreams of the boys and strives to make a positive impact to help them reach their full potential. Thank you for all you do to continue the legacy of transforming the lives of the boys who reside at Christ Child House.
